
Background: The Sonora Police Department Explorer Post 364 puts out the American flag six times a year, Memorial Day, Flag Day, 4th of July, Labor Day, 9-11 and Veterans Day. Over the years some of the holes that the poles go into get full of dirt, the caps are hard to come off and the flags and poles get damaged.

Discussion: In 2009 another Boy Scout working on his Eagle Scout Project (Avery Jones) repaired and added American flags on Washington Street. It is with great appreciation that I induce to you Will Antinetti. Will was born and raised in Tuolumne County. He is a senior at Summerville High School. He has shot trap for four years and this year he is president of the Trap Club.

Will started out in Cub Scouts when he was in the first grade. He became a Boy Scout when he entered the sixth grade. He has worked his way up from Scout to a Life Scout. His final step to becoming an Eagle Scout was his community service project. I talked to Will about repairing our American flags that we put out on holidays. He accepted the challenge.

Will raised the money to replace and repair the flags, holes and flag poles. He arranged several work days with other Boy Scouts to repair the flags and install eight new flag holders.
